PROGRAM SUMMARY

LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP OBJECTIVES

Darts Alberta hosts four Provincial Championships per year:

- Adult Elite Provincial Championship
- Youth Provincial Championship
- League Men's Triples Provincials
- League Women's Doubles Provincials

The primary objective of the Adult Elite and Youth Provincial Championships is to develop championship teams of athletes to compete in National Competition.

The objective of the Men's Triples and Women's Doubles Member League Championship is to offer a program exclusive to our Member Leagues, encouraging league members to compete in an event targeted at a relatively equitable caliber of competition. It is the goal of Darts Alberta to provide a team-event atmosphere complete with camaraderie and competitive spirit.

WOMEN'S DOUBLES PROGRAM SUMMARY

- Each Women's or Mixed Member League may host a Women's Doubles Member League Playoff to advance teams to Women's Doubles League Provincial Championships.
 - Approximately 50% of the team entries will advance to the League Provincials.
- All teams must meet the eligibility guidelines.
- Each Women's Doubles team shall be permitted to carry one spare if registered and paid at the start of the first level of competition.
- Each Team Match shall consist of the best of 3 matches, consisting of:
 - 1 – Doubles matches
 - 2 – Singles matches
- Every match against your opponent shall be a Best of 3 Modified Chicago-Style Competition consisting of 1 leg of 301 Double-In Double-Out, 1 leg of 501 Straight-In Double Out and 1 leg of Open Tactics.

- Each team shall begin competition at the Member League level.
- Awards will be provided at each level of competition.

MEMBER LEAGUE ASSISTANCE

Please contact Darts Alberta if you require any assistance with the organizing and running of Member League Championship Playoffs.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Darts Alberta shall be responsible for providing all awards as outlined in the Awards Package.

The Member League shall be responsible for any expenses relating to the hosting and administration of their Member League playoff.

Participants are responsible for their own expenses to attend the League Provincials.

MEMBER LEAGUE DEADLINES

- All playoffs must be completed and results submitted by no later than February 15th
- NO LATE SUBMISSIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

LEAGUE PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP

The League Provincial Championship shall be a one-day event.



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MEMBER LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

RULES OF ELIGIBILITY

LEAGUE ELIGIBILITY

Each Member League, in good standing with Darts Alberta, shall be eligible to host one Women's Doubles League Qualifier, per season.

The Member League Organizers must agree to operate the event under the guidelines provided in this Member League Championship Kit.

The Member League Championship program shall be open to all members of Darts Alberta Member Leagues, provided the team meets eligibility requirements.

Players listed on the current Darts Alberta List of Suspended Players are ineligible to compete.

TEAM ELIGIBILITY

Each team member, including 'registered spares' must be a registered member-in-good-standing of that Member League, during the current playing season and registered with Darts Alberta as a member of that league.

Each team shall consist of two (2) players and shall be permitted to carry one (1) SPARE, provided the spare is a "registered and paid" team member at the start of the 1st level of competition.

After the start of the first level of competition, no team can replace, substitute or add players to the team's roster.

To achieve the objectives of the Women's Doubles Member League Championship, **a maximum of ONE ELITE athlete** shall be permitted per team, including the registered spare'.

All team members, including the spare, must be Members of the league in which they are playing in that League Qualifier. However, not necessarily from the same team from within regular league play.

MULTIPLE LEAGUE MEMBERS

In the event an individual is a member of more than one Darts Alberta Member League, that member may compete on a team in all Member Leagues, until such times as that individual's team has achieved qualification to advance to the League Provincial Championship.

ELITE ATHLETES

For the purposes of this program, a female elite athlete is defined as:

- Any Darts Alberta member listed within the top 64 on the current official WDF ranking list.
- Any Darts Alberta member listed within the top 32 on the current official NDFC ranking list.
- Any Darts Alberta member listed within the top 16 on the most recent April 30th Darts Alberta ranking list.
- Any member of Team Alberta who qualified or competed in an Adult National Championship in the previous 2 years.
- Any Darts Alberta member which competed in an International Darts Championship in the previous 5 years, excluding Open Tournaments.

An Elite Athletes list is included with your package for reference. Note, that this list may not include competitors that have recently moved from another province, recently reinstated as a member, etc. If an organizer is uncertain of a competitor's classification as an elite athlete, please contact the Administrator (administrator@dartsalberta.com) for confirmation. Darts Alberta's decision shall be final.



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MEMBER LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

RULES & FORMAT OF PLAY

GENERAL RULES OF PLAY

The following Format & Rules of Play shall be applicable to ALL levels of competition.

The Member League Championship shall be played in accordance with the NDFC Official Rules of Play. All matters, not covered by these or by the NDFC Official Rules of Play, shall be decided by the event organizer whose decision shall be final.

ENTRY FEE

\$10.00 per person for each registered team member.

There is NO ADDITIONAL ENTRY FEE to compete in the League Provincial Championship.

TEAM COMPOSITION

Each team must meet the guidelines of eligibility.

After the start of the first level of competition, no team can replace, substitute or add players to their team's roster. NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE GRANTED. Therefore, teams are encouraged to sign-up a spare in case a qualified player becomes unavailable for the next level of competition.

WOMEN'S DOUBLES PLAYER LINE-UP

Each team shall declare its two competitors from their "team roster" prior to the start of play for each match against the opposing team.

Prior to the start of play for each match, a random draw shall take place to designate each team's player line-up.

No team member may be substituted by another team member, after the start of a match against the opposing team.

Once that match has completed, a different mix of two players can be declare (from amongst the team's roster) for the next match against another team.

In Double Knockout, where B Side wins the first match and a final match is required, each team's player line-up shall be redrawn.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

The format, determined prior to the start of play at each level, shall be based on the number of team entries for that event, as outlined in this "Member League Championship Kit".

LEAGUE PLAYOFF FORMAT

During the Member League playoffs, the Provincial format must be followed.

PROVINCIAL MATCH FORMAT

Every individual match against your opponent shall be a Best of 3 Modified Chicago-Style Competition consisting of 1 leg of 301 Double-In Double-Out, 1 leg of 501 Straight-In Double Out and 1 leg of Open Tactics. This format will remain the same regardless of whether you are playing a team, double or singles match.

For organizers unfamiliar with the Tactics Format, Tactics Rules of Play are included for your reference.

Each team match shall consist of the Best of 3 'match wins' against the opposing team to determine the overall 'match win' for one point.

- 1 – Doubles match
- 3 – Singles matches

Leg	Team 1 / Player	vs	Team 2 / Player
1	A & B	vs	A & B
2	A	vs	B
3	B	vs	A

Unless there is an insufficient amount of boards available, both singles matches must be played concurrently.



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ORDER OF PLAY

Due to the Tactics component and the inability to determine when that game will be held during the match, a bull-up will be conducted before EVERY game.

Prior to the start of each individual match against the opposing team, singles or doubles match, a coin toss shall be conducted.

The winner of the TOSS shall have choice of the first game (301 DIDO, 501 SIDO or Tactics) AND choice of who throws first for the bull.

The loser of the TOSS shall have choice of the second game (one of the two remaining) AND choice of who throws first for the bull.

If the case of a tie, requiring the final and deciding game to determine the 'match win', the winner of the ORIGINAL TOSS shall have choice of who throws first for the bull for the one remaining type of game not yet played.

The team that wins the bull-up before each game shall always throw first in that game.

The individual designated to bull-up need not be the player on that team that starts the match for their team.

TIE-BREAKER RULES

Where ties occur in Round Robin play, the ties shall be broken according to the Tie-Breaker Rules contained in this Member League Championship Kit.

TACTICS RULES

The following is an excerpt from the TAME (Tactics Association on Mondays in Edmonton) Member Dart League's Rules of Play.

SCORING AREAS

The scoring areas of the dart board shall consist of the numbered areas thirteen (13) through twenty (20) inclusive, all doubles and triples wherever scored and the bull.

CLOSING AND KILLING SCORING AREAS

In order for a team or player to score points on any of the designated scoring areas, that team or player shall first score three (3) of that designated area.

Having acquired three (3) of any designated scoring area, a team or player may score points on that area until such time as the opposing team or player hits three (3) of that designated scoring area.

CHALKING

All darts scored prior to a team or player being entitled to accumulate points shall be marked with an "X" or "X's", as the case may be, and upon acquiring three (3) such X's in any given designated scoring area a line shall be drawn through all three (3) X's. Failure to draw a line through all three X's shall result in the opposing team or player treating that designated scoring area as still open and as such, may accumulate points on that designated scoring area. The line may not be drawn until after the throw during which the omission was noticed.

REMOVING DARTS

A dart must remain in the board until it has been marked with the applicable number of X's and/or points. (E.g. A player may remove a non-scoring dart prior to marking any scoring darts. At the end of his throw, a player may remove each scoring dart after it is scored or remove all scoring darts at the end of scoring all darts.) **Failure to score the dart before it has been removed will cause that dart to be null and void.**

WINNING THE GAME

A game is won when a team or player, as the case may be, has completed each designated scoring area with three X's and has accumulated points in excess of the opposition in that game.

TIES

In the event of a tie (in points with all scoring areas closed) each player involved in the tied game shall throw three darts at the bull. The player or team, as the case may be, who accumulates the most bulls shall be declared the winner (of that game). Double bulls scored shall count as two bulls.

MEMBER LEAGUE HANDOUTS

Brochures have been provided for your members to heighten awareness of this Darts Alberta Program and to answer common questions asked by members. A "How to Play Tactics" segment is included for members unfamiliar with this format, as well as a Team Registration Form.

A space has been provided to affix a label to advise the date and location of your member league playoff.



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MEMBER LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

DETAILED TOURNAMENT FORMAT & PROVINCIAL QUALIFICATION

GENERAL

All levels of competition shall be played according to the Format and Rules of Play as outlined in this Member League Championship Kit.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

The general rule of thumb for the sectional format is that no section shall consist of more than 4 teams.

2 TO 4 TEAMS

The tournament format shall be a complete Round Robin. Each team entered shall play one complete match against each of the other teams entered.

5 TO 8 TEAMS

The tournament format shall be a modified Round Robin advancing to a Knockout Round. Each team entered shall play in one of TWO round-robin groups and shall play one complete match against each other team in that group.

In each group, the top two teams shall advance to the last 4 where they shall compete in a bracket draw knockout for overall results.

9 TO 16 TEAMS

Each team entered shall play in one of FOUR round-robin groups and shall play one complete match against each other team in that group.

In each group, the top two teams shall advance to the last 8 where they shall compete in a bracket draw knockout for overall results.

17 TO 32 TEAMS

Each team entered shall play in one of EIGHT round-robin groups and shall play one Team Match against each other team in that group.

In each group, the top two teams shall advance to the last 16 where they shall compete in a bracket draw knockout for overall results.

33 TEAMS OR MORE

A double knockout shall be played.

TEAMS ADVANCEMENT

The following number of teams shall advance from the Member League Playoff to the League Provincial Championships:

The above formula is based on 50% of the teams advancing.

From those teams that have not qualified, it is suggested that ties be broken to determine the first alternate team and second alternate team, in the event that one or more of the qualified teams are unable to compete at the Provincial League Championship.



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MEMBER LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

TIE BREAKER RULES

GENERAL

The purpose of the following detailed explanation is to avoid conflicts pertaining to the methods being used to break ties. These tie-breaker rules are to be used for ALL ties occurring during Round Robin play at any level of competition of the Member League Championship.

TIE BREAKER FOR COMPLETE ROUND-ROBIN EVENT

When two or more teams are tied during a complete Round Robin event, final positioning shall be determined as follows:

TWO-WAY TIE: FOR FIRST PLACE

A coin toss shall be used to determine choice of who shoots first for the bull.

Both teams shall play one doubles game of 701 Straight-In Double-Out. The winner of the match shall be declared the champions.

THREE OR MORE TEAMS TIED FOR FIRST PLACE

Team numbers shall be randomly drawn to determine who shoots first for the bull.

All three teams shall play one doubles game of 701 Straight-In Double-Out, with all Teams playing concurrently on the same board. The first team to finish the game shall be declared the champions. The game shall continue, with each winning team awarded the next available position accordingly, until only one team is remaining.

TIE BREAKER FOR ROUND-ROBIN ADVANCING TO KNOCKOUT

When Elimination Will Occur

When one or more of those teams tied will be eliminated from advancing to the Knock-Out Round, all teams that are tied shall play one doubles game of 701 Straight-In Double-Out, with all Teams playing concurrently on the same board.

Team numbers shall be randomly drawn to determine who shoots first for the bull.

The first team to finish the game shall be awarded with the 1st available finishing position. The game shall continue, with each winning team awarded the next available position accordingly, until only one team is remaining.

When All Teams Will Advance

Where ties occur and ALL teams tied continue to advance to the knockout round regardless of the tie-breaker results, final positions shall be determined by countback.

The final positions will be established on the basis of the match wins played in the Round Robin between all players or teams that are tied. Count the match wins/losses of all tied teams. The team with the most match wins would receive the first available position, with the player with the least wins receiving the last available position.

Using the process of elimination, should an additional tie result when adding these points, conduct another countback amongst only those remaining tied until definite positions have been determined.

In case of a tie of 3 or more teams that cannot be broken through countback one player will be randomly drawn from amongst all players from the team roster that competed in the event. Each team's representative would throw nine (9) darts and the team with the highest total scored shall be awarded with the first available finishing position, with the lowest score receiving the last available finishing position.

2008-09 AWARDS PACKAGE

WOMEN'S DOUBLES LEAGUE PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP

1ST PLACE PROVINCIAL TEAM

Each team member, including an eligible spare, shall be awarded a Darts Alberta League Provincial Championship Gold Medal.

Each team member, including an eligible spare, shall be awarded a Darts Alberta League Provincial Championship Jacket.

The TEAM shall be awarded transportation expenses to attend the 2010 Canadian Open in Gander Newfoundland, as follows:

- **TWO** airline tickets or equitable ground transportation expenses.
- Should air transportation be chosen, any additional team member would be responsible for their own travel expenses if accompanying the team.
- Should one or more of the team members of the Member League Provincial Team Champions become eligible to attend the 2010 Adult National Championship as part of Team Alberta, the transportation package will be modified accordingly.

The team shall be awarded with hotel accommodations at the 2010 Canadian Open in Gander Newfoundland, as follows:

- 1 hotel room x 2 nights per room based on double occupancy.
- Should one or more of the team members of the Member League Provincial Team Champions become eligible to attend the 2010 Adult National Championship as part of Team Alberta, the accommodations package may be modified accordingly.
- Should a team member choose to travel with the team, she shall be permitted to share accommodations with the team.
- **TOTAL VALUE: Approximately \$3,000.00**

2ND PLACE TEAM

Each team member, including an eligible spare shall be awarded a Darts Alberta League Provincial Championship Silver Medal and a Darts Alberta League Provincial Championship Runners-Up Dart Shirt.

TOTAL VALUE: Approximately \$200.00

3RD PLACE TEAM

Each team member, including "registered spare" shall be awarded a Darts Alberta Provincial Championship Bronze Medal.

TOTAL VALUE: Approximately \$30.00

LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

1ST PLACE TEAM OF EACH MEMBER LEAGUE

Each team member, including competing registered spares shall be awarded a personalized Darts Alberta Member League Champion Banner/Pennant.

NOTE: Darts Alberta reserves the right to modify this Awards Package annually.

A player registered on a team, must have competed in at least one match in either the League Playoff or the League Provincials in order to be eligible for ANY prize package.
